# An Excerpt from the Word in Season January, February, March 2018

Sunday, March 4, 2018

John 2:13-22

#### Zeal for your house will consume me.. (vs 17)

When religion becomes too casual and too much like commerce, there's a problem. When we think we can give anything to God in exchange for blessings, there's a problem. Blessing is a gift, not a commodity. Temple worship in Jerusalem had become both rote and commercial, and Jesus expressed anger and took action. The temple took 46 years to build, and he claimed that he could tear it down and rebuild it in three days. No wonder the leaders were confused and angry!

But the most radical part of the story is that Jesus was really saying that he now was God's residence. He graphically announced that God didn't live in the temple, but had taken up a new residence. Even more startling for us, Jesus promised that he would come and reside with us, in the form of the Holy Spirit.

So now we are the temple, the house that has to be guarded from lesser purposes. Our bodies are a temple for the Holy Spirit. What a concept! But that's what we are promised. What does it mean for us to treat ourselves as a holy dwelling? At the very least it means that self-care is about more than ourselves.

# Indwelling Spirit, help e tend the small flame of you that is living within me with the utmost care. Amen.

#### **Chaos to Comfort**

(Excerpt from The Lutheran Message)

We were playing softball on a spring day when an ominous looking cloud moved into our area. As it kept getting darker, we all headed for shelter. The sky had an eerie yellow look to it; yet rain did not come. There was a strange silence; no sounds came from the birds. Eventually the clouds moved on. In a very short time, we were stunned to hear the weather front had spawned a tornado that swept through a small town just four miles to the north of ours. We learned later that 13 of the 125 residents were killed, and the town was utterly destroyed.

Many people in our town had loved ones – friends and relatives – in the neighboring town and were devastated by the terrible chaos caused by the storm. This caused us to ponder why were spared while our sister town was annihilated. Some folks were angry with God, asking how he could allow this tragedy in a world He loves so much.

However, in the midst of the pain and suffering, cooler heads – faithful members of our churches – began quietly and effectively ministering to those who were hurting and in need. There were those who opened up their homes to those left homeless, others busily provided food and clothing to those left with nothing but the clothes on their back. Still others were involved in comforting the highly distressed, some who seemed to be inconsolable until faithful Christians provided a shoulder to lean on or to cry on. The comforter would stay with the grieving until they could control their emotions and would sometimes pray with them when they parted.

As a young person I had never been around this kind of tragedy. It was a significant discovery to me that one's presence on behalf of a grieving person might mean more than anything we might say. God has blessed us with the privilege of ministering as a comforter to the grieving, just as Paul the Apostle proclaimed; "Blessed be the God and Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our tribulation, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any trouble, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God" (2 Corinthians 1:3-4)

Yes, there was great tragedy, but there were many testimonies of rescue and good works and some amazing stories about how some had been spared. God's peace and comfort were truly present in the life of the people of these two towns.
